What is a city?

A city is a large settlement where lots of people live and work. Businesses and banks are located in the centre of a city. There are shopping districts full of shops, restaurants, cafes and bars. Cities have good transport links so people can easily get in and out to work and shop. Train stations, bus stations and coach depots are usually in the centre of a city. Some people live in the residential areas surrounding cities, called suburbs.

Urban art

Urban art is art created on walls and buildings. Graffiti is a form of urban art that is mainly made up of words and sometimes pictures too.



settlement - a place, typically one which has previously been uninhabited, where people establish a community.

residential - an area where there are private houses, not offices and factories.

monument - a statue, building, or other structure erected to commemorate a notable person or event.
