Cloud Forests

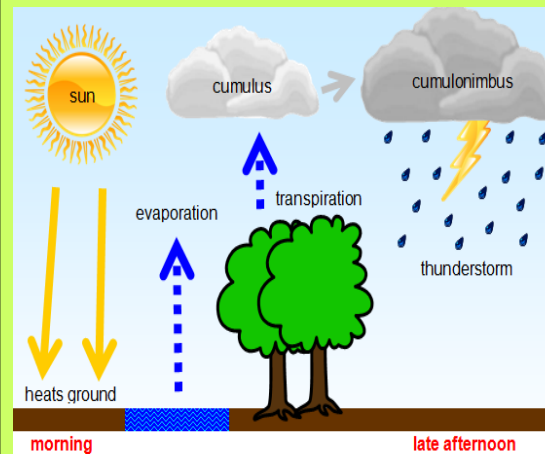
A cloud forest is a tropical, or sub-tropical, evergreen, montane, moist forest. They often have long-lasting low level cloud cover, and mosses covering the ground and vegetation.
