Confidential Health Advice

The School Nurse Service have a new text message system for parents and carers of children in primary schools in Lambeth and Southwark. You can text a school nurse to get confidential advice about your child's health related issues, including:



- ♦ bedwetting
- ♦ sleep
- ♦ dental health
- ♦ support with medical conditions in school
- ♦ keeping safe
- ♦ bullying
- ♦ keeping healthy
- ♦ emotional health and wellbeing

The service is available Monday-Friday 9am to 5pm throughout the year, except Bank Holidays. You cannot call the number, it will only receive text messages. You should receive a response within one working day.
