



Oasis Summer Activities Sessional Workers

Summer Activity Sessional Worker: As part of a team you will be responsible for organising healthy activities for children and their families. To provide supervision of the children on trips and maintain a safe environment for those involved. As the activity worker, you will represent the Hub, welcome the community and be responsible for ensuring the safe and successful delivery of a range of activities related to various themes across the days.

Summer Activity Sessional Cook: To cook nutritious hot food from fresh ingredients at summer activity sessions. As the Cook, you will represent the Hub, by producing a variety of delicious meals suitable for the community and be responsible for ensuring the safe and hygienic use of the kitchens and food preparation sites.

Lambeth Council is considering proposals for 8 Albert Embankment which includes a new permanent home for the London Fire Brigade museum. The museum will play an essential role in celebrating London's rich history and will educate people of all ages about fire safety.



The museum forms part of U+I and the Fire Brigade's wider proposals to transform 8 Albert Embankment, which will deliver a new modern fire station for Lambeth, as well as 417 homes – with a significant proportion of affordable housing – and work space to support over 1,500 jobs.
