### De-colonising the Curriculum

Since George Floyd's tragic death, we have been working to create and implement a curriculum which teaches history and geography from a wider range of perspectives, including tackling some difficult topics in a child-centred and appropriate way at the right age. We have done this in a number of ways, for example:

- Buying more books for the library and classrooms which are by and about global majority people.
- Reviewing our curriculum so that we can include different perspectives, events and stories of people from global majority backgrounds throughout the year and throughout the curriculum.
- Seeing our curriculum though the lenses of social justice so that issues such as race, gender, climate justice and ableism are discussed and debated critically in our classrooms.

#### Opportunities to get involved

If you would like to have a say in helping our school tackle racism, there are two areas you could get involved with:

First, for Black History Month and beyond we would like to be able to share many more global majority stories in our lessons and we would like these to be from the Johanna or Hub community. To do this we would like to invite you to **share a story** from your culture or share traditional crafts, music or recipes. This could be through a short clip or by visiting a class. Please contact your class rep, Jane or Flic if you are interested.

Secondly, we would like to create **a steering committee** to support, advise and shape the future work we would like to do around making sure our school and curriculum reflect the diversity of our community effectively. If you would like to use your voice to impact the school in this way, Dawn or Jane would love to hear from you.

### Sumdog Maths Contest





### Gate Opening from Monday





### Our Curriculum and Ethos

We have designed our curriculum to meet the needs of all, striving for personal as well as academic and vocational excellent. Through our curriculum, we will achieve outcomes that drive social mobility and give everyone freedom of choice throughout their lives.

The Oasis ethos and 9 Habits are a foundation stone to the design and delivery of our curriculum. We know that the development of character doesn't happen by chance, but by purpose and intention: it is therefore an explicit part of our curriculum. We therefore work hard at preparing our students to be the best version of themselves not just for todya, but for their futures too.



Our curriculum has been designed to ensure our young people thrive, achieve and flourish. It enables them to understand what it is to be human and equips them for life so that they become kind and model citizens. Our curriculum not only develops our young people academically but socially, emotionally, cuturally, physically and spiritually.

For the Early Years (nursery and reception years), we provide a curriculum based on planned, active and exploratory play and develop the physical dexterity creativity, critical thinking, language skills and social awareness they will need for later years.

### Our Curriculum - Term 1

The curriculum is an important part of our school and staff have spent considerable amounts of time developing and improving it so that the children get a great experience. We teach all subjects discretely, ensuring that they are given the time and resources they deserve. Links are made between subjects as knowledge from Geography is often needed for History, and vice versa. There is a key subject focus for each half term, raising the profile of one subject and cycling throughout the year. The table on this page shows the key learning taking place this term (Autumn I, up until half term holidays) for each year group. The 'Knowledge Organiser' gives you an overview of the key subject knowledge the children must know by the end of this unit as well as key vocabulary lists that the children must know and use.

YR	Red	All About Me - a PSED (Personal, Social and Emotional Development) focus on who we are, who are family and friends are, and what is special about each of us.		
Y1	Orange	<b>Memory Box</b> - a historical focus on our own childhood memories, including school, toys and entertainment past and present.		
Y2	Yellow	<b>Towers, Tunnels and Turrets</b> - a historial focus on towers and castles and a geographical focus on the use of buildings including knowing some key towers in use today such as the Tower of London.		
Y3	Green	<b>Tribal Tales</b> - a historical focus on the human achievements from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.		
Y4	Blue	<b>Blue Abyss</b> - a scientific focus on marine habitats.		
Y5	Indigo	<b>Journey to Jo'burg</b> - a geographical focus on mapping and atlas skills, including South Africa.		
Y6	Violet	<b>Blood Heart</b> - a scientific focus on the cirulatory system, including the heart, and how to keep our heart healthy.

Please spend time reading these with your child/ren at home, helping them reflect on their previous learning and the learning to come.
