School Meal Price Increase

After half term, school meals will be increasing to £2.30 per day. That is £11.50 per week. If you believe you could be entitled to Free School Meals, please see Nicky in the school office and check as soon as possible. Even if your child is in Year R, 1 and 2 (and so get a UNIVERSAL free school meal already), there are additional benefits to school if your child qualifies which helps to subsidise a range of things from school visits to providing additional tuition in school

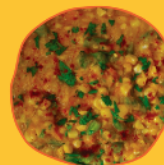
