Online Safety and Gangs

Growing Against Violence (GAV) growingagainstviolence.org.uk is a charity protecting young people against peer-to-peer violence both on the streets and online. This is the 3rd year we have worked with them and on March 22nd they will be back in school running workshops with our older children.

This year, we have asked them to run an additional parent session, which will take place on Microsoft Teams at 5pm on March 22nd. Through the presentation, he will discuss keeping young people safe online, as well as share information about Gang involvement, what this means and how young people get caught up in them, sometimes without even realising.

You can join in with this either:

- a) At home, via the link emailed to you once you sign up.
- b) In school, in a space with the Teams call set up for you.

It is such an important presentation about how to keep our young people safe, and I would urge all of you to attend either from home or in school.
