Lessons take place on weekday evenings 4pm-7pm and on Saturdays 9.00am-4.00pm.

Uniform Policy

It is getting to that time of year when many children need to have new uniform for September. Please check **BEFORE** you buy that you are buying the correct uniform.

We have not made any changes to our uniform policy. We have been lenient during the covid period, as people have not been able to get out to shops and many have struggled financially. However, our country is getting back to normal and so we must make sure that children are wearing the correct uniform.

We make sure here at OAJ that our uniform is affordable for all our families. Please do speak to us if you are experiencing a particularly difficult time and we can see what we can do to help. Don't forget we hold our "Pre-loved" uniform sales regularly, where you can buy uniform that other children have grown out of.

What things must I buy with school logos?

Items with a * next to them can only be bought from our provider **SCHOOL UNIFORM DIRECT** at https://schooluniformdirect.co.uk/

What should children wear on non-PE days?

Children should wear:

- Navy sweatshirt or cardigan wtih logo*
- White polo shirt (with or without logo)
- Dark grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- Grey socks/tights
- Black shoes (no boots or trainers)
- OPTIONAL: checked-pleat summer dress (blue/white)
- OPTIONAL: waterproof, reversible fleece jacket with logo*



Will you keep the PE Days?

Yes, we think that having children come to school on PE days already in their kit saves valuable learning time. Please make sure that children DO NOT have branded items (i.e. no Adidas, Nike etc).

Please ensure that children have:

- plain, navy blue shorts
- plain, navy blue jogging bottoms (no logos)
- Navy sweatshirt or cardigan wtih logo*
- White school t-shirt with logo*
- Plimsolls or black trainers
- school logo PE bag*









What bags should my child have?

Children must have a school logo bag* and PE drawstring bag*. They can have the reading folder or infant rucksack, however we have found that the larger Junior Rucksack is ideal to carry children's things to and from school and lasts the whole school career if you take care of it.


What about hair and jewelry?
