Attendance Next Year

We are clear on the importance of education and the links between attendance and academic outcomes. After 3 school years of Covid restrictions and the impact in school, I am writing to make clear some changes around attendance in the next academic year.

We work hard to recognise good attendance in the school. We have a weekly trophy for the class with the best attendance and the least late marks. We also recognise individual 100% attendance at the end of every term.

We know that there will be times where children miss school for a variety of reasons, but these should be rare across a year. There may be more serious reasons for non-attendance and school staff and school leaders should be aware of these reasons so we can take them in to account.

We will be monitoring two things:

1. The overall percentage attendance. The target for this is 96% or better.
2. The number of periods of absence. Any period of non-attendance will be monitored and lead to contact from someone at the school.

If there is anything we can do to support attendance, please don't hesitate to contact us so we can prepare and support as soon as possible.
