The children could not believe that technology as we know it was not invented, and that they had to use a blackboard and chalk in school! They had a whole day of no technology - which was challenging for children and staff alike.

The children really loved the random hand/ fingernail and shoe inspections. The afternoon was really interesting as the class were divided by gender, which was commonplace in Victorian times - boys had to do a victorian toy-making activity (cup and ball) whilst the girls had to do "cooking" (making cheese sandwiches).
