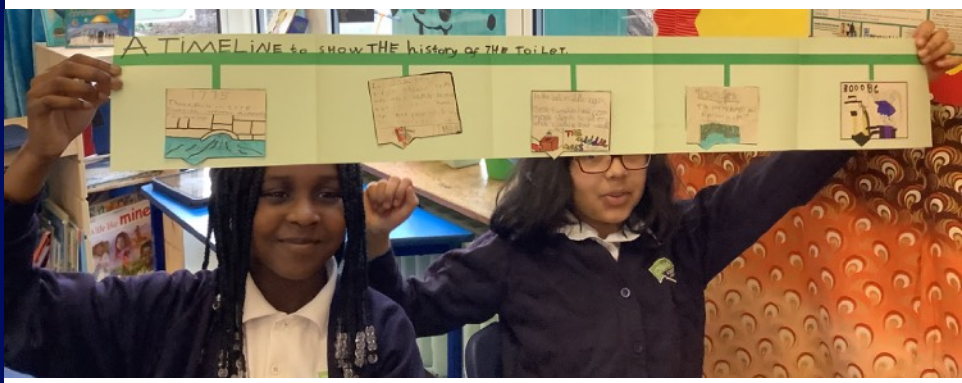
Parent's Evening 28th March

Nursery Places/Stay&Play

We have listened to parents and carers who have asked for more flexible Nursery provision. After Easter, we are able to do the following and will try this for the summer term:

School Day 9am - 12pm, 12.15-3.15pm

Stay and Play (soft start) from 8.45-9am

Wrapz Breakfast: 7.30-8.45am

Wrapz After School: 3.15-5.50pm

NURSERY FREE FUNDING: children can use their 15 and 30 hours funding towards the cost of school day and wrap around care provision. For example, nursery children can come to school for 2 full days (7,30am to 3.15pm) using the 15 hours funding, rather than 5 mornings or 5 afternoons.

NURSERY COSTS: If you are not entitled to the 30 free hours, it costs **£10 per day to top up from your 15 hours entitlement.** You will need to pay for Wrapz breakfast and after school provision if your child does more than 30 hours per week.

Nursery children must book at least one week in advance for the Wrapz breakfast or After School provision, as we need to ensure we have the right ratio of staff.

Please contact the office for more information on our bespoke provision for Nursery pupils and costs for all pupils; we are accepting children for Summer and Autumn Terms.
