Pupil Parliament

We are looking forward to our first Pupil Parliament meeting next Friday. In Oasis, many children have the opportunity to become leaders and this is one way. There are two children from each class elected to represent the views of their classmates. We will have some key topics to think about next week and then the children will go back, discuss with their class and get ready to report at the next meeting.

Cost of living

We know that many of our families are facing a very difficult financial time. We are doing lots of things at school and in the Hub to help make things a little easier:

- Oasis Living Room - see page 2 for more details of what is on.
- Breakfast for All - Monday/Tuesday/Thursday/Friday 8.30am (gates open 8.30-8.35am) where all our children can get free cereal in school.
- Help to apply for Free School Meals (FSM): check if you are eligible for Free School Meals by talking to Cara in the school office. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 do automatically get a free school meal under the UNIVERSAL free school meals (UFSM) programme from our government, however FSM helps school as we get additional money to support the children in other areas such as learning, visits, uniform costs, reduced costs for Wrapz etc. Ask Cara for more information.
- Reduced price places for Wrapz breakfast and after school provision.

Sumdog Contest - starting Nov 25th

A new Sumdog contest begins next Friday... make sure you are ready! For the score to count, the Oasis Community Learning Sumdog Maths Context activity must be showing in the green panel on the left of the pupil's screen when they click to start each game. Check with your teacher if you cannot see it.

Scores are based on correct answers. A Class's score is the average of the scores from all the pupils from that class who take part. To appear on the leaderboard, at least 5 pupils from a class need to play.





Stranger Danger

Whilst the risk posed from strangers is rare, it is really important to make children aware of simple tips they can follow to keep themselves a little safer.

This video on Stranger Danger is designed to highlight a few key points that you can use to have important conversations as a family. It is aimed at children aged 4 - 11 years and will help to get us all talking about what helps keep children safe.

We would advise parents/carers to talk to their children about:

- Who their safe adults are
- Where safe places are near them, if help is needed
- How to keep safe on the internet from strangers, including people pretending to be other children to trick them. This includes mobile phone apps and games that have 'chat' functions - these can be just as dangerous as a stranger on the street.
