Q: How much sleep do children need a night?

A: Around 12 hours per night for most children:

- 3 to 5 year olds need 12 hours (10-13 hours, including naps).
- 6-12 year olds need 9-12 hours

On Monday, Year 4 had the opportunity to visit the Neasden Hindu Temple in West London – the first traditional Hindu stone temple in Europe! We learnt a lot about its construction using only traditional methods and materials, including sending marble from Italy to be crafted by volunteers all the way in India, to be shipped back to London ready for building! We learnt about the fascinating rituals and beliefs Hindus hold by watching those in the temple worship, and ended our day with a look around the temple's exhibition charting the history of the religion and the important figures within.
