
Theme

The theme for Year 4 this term is "Who Am I and Who Am I Becoming."

This theme will be explored across the whole curriculum, encouraging the children to think about themselves and explore their place in the world. They'll be learning about local geography including our own country and its regions, while also comparing ourselves and our geography to that of other countries around the world. Our focus country this year will be Mozambique, a country rich in culture and history, but one that also has links with the world of Oasis.

Knowledge organiser


Below is our knowledge organiser for Geography, which can be found on Showbie under 'Geography Resources'.



English


Our class reader this term is Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, which is always a popular one!

We will use this as the starting point for developing our own independent narratives based on characters in fantastical settings, incorporating new skills into our writing to create exciting stories.



Maths

This term, we'll be building on the foundations of year 3 and expanding our knowledge of place value and more advanced addition and subtraction, including tenths and hundredths.



In Year 4, multiplication and timestables are a big focus for us, culminating in the nationwide Multiplication Check in the Summer term. We will be doing lots of work on these, so keep practicing at home! This can be on the iPad using SumDog and Times Tables Rockstars, or can be done using flashcards and other paper-based methods.

R.E.

Our R.E. focus this term is Hinduism.

This will give us a chance to look at the cultural and artistic side of the religion, while looking at the history.

Most importantly, we will be discussing the core beliefs of Hindus such as good karma and bad karma.

History

In history this term, we tie in historical ideas with our theme of 'Who Am I and Who Am I Becoming'. This means that we delve deeper into understanding the country in which we live and the historical discoveries and periods that define it and helped form the modern Britain that we know today. We begin by looking at the invention and introduction of railway systems in Britain, before learning about coal mining. These two pivotal moments in British history are linked and we will use a range of new tools to analyse them.

Art and Design

Continuing with the theme of 'Who am I and Who Am I Becoming', the children will be developing their artistic skills by studying 'Self-Portrait' by Rembrandt, while making use of shading to show light and shadow and expanding their knowledge of artistic materials.
