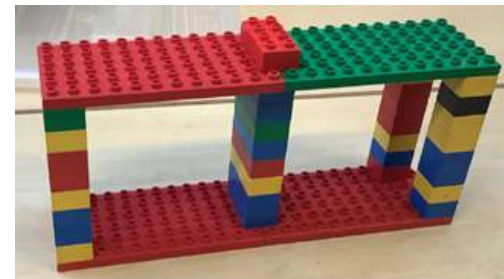

Year 1 Bright Monday Work

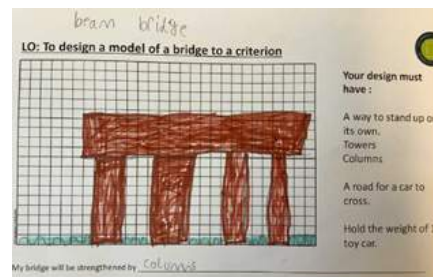
Year 1 explored the purpose of structures, discussed what makes a structure stable or unstable and discussed how they could strengthen a weak structure. They then deigned our own bridges.
